Who Can Make Referrals?

Anyone can make a referral when they believe someone would benefit from County Board services.

How Does Someone Qualify?

In addition to a qualifying diagnosis by a medical professional or licensed psychologist, children ages 6 to 15 must exhibit a substantial functional limitation in at least three of the following areas of major life activity as appropriate for their age: mobility; self-care; self-direction; capacity for independent living; learning; receptive and expressive language.

Who Do I Contact to Make a Referral?

Please contact the Perry County Board of DD Children's Program Office which is the starting point for services for children birth up to age 6.

Services and Eligibility



Preschool

Services for Children ages 3-5 are available for those who are diagnosed with medical conditions likely to result in a delay, or have been determined Part B eligible with an Individualized Education Plan (IEP) with their local school district.

School-Age

Children ages 6-15 must be determined eligible through the administration of the Children's Ohio Eligibility Determination Instrument (C.O.E.D.I.).

Transition

Children ages 16 & older are determined eligible through the administration of the Ohio Eligibility Determination Instrument (O.E.D.I.).
